


Q3 In which region do you live?




Q5 Do you have a partner who is also a registered Carer living with you?



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

Q7 Do you have any other caring responsibilities (for example, caring for a close relative)?





Q8 Which of the following categories best describes your employment status?






Q10 Your cultural status - are you Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander?






Q13 Do you have a chronic health condition that you are managing alongside your caring responsibilities?


Q14 What form of care do you provide?

Q15 How long have you been a registered Carer?



Q22 Do you feel you have a good understanding of the child protection system in South Australia?









Q25 Do you know your rights and responsibilities under the current legislation and associated processes?





Q26 Do you know your rights and responsibilities under the proposed Children and Young People (Safety) Bill 2017 (SA) legislation?





Q27 Do you want to know more about the proposed legislation and your rights and responsibilities as a Carer?





Q29 Has there been any impact on your caring role over the past 12 months (or since the release of the Nyland Report in August 2016) that you feel have occurred as a result of system changes?







Q44 Supporting development of your child and/or young people placed in your care - do you feel you have...





Q45 Have you accessed support for independence and transition from care planning for...




